Karrendi teachers had a very busy and productive student free day last week, focused on planning their structured Literacy Blocks. We were joined by educational consultant Debbie Draper, who presented on the different elements of a Literacy Block that all teachers should include in their practice. This work was informed by the Science of Reading, which is the body of research that shows how the brain learns to read. Teachers had time to plan to ensure they are covering all the components Debbie spoke about, so that all students are receiving evidence-based, high-quality instruction.

This term classes spent time exploring what it means to be a leader and role model at Karrendi Primary School. Each class then elected two peers to represent them on the Student Voice Committee. Student Voice is an integral part of our school community and is a process which celebrates, acknowledges and learns from the opinions and perspectives of all of our students.


Finance Reminder


