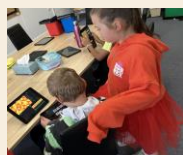
A Message from Ms Sam

A Message from Miss Schinella

Blending is the process of pushing sounds together to form a word.

Learning how to blend is an essential skill in learning to read.

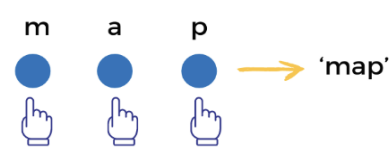
Students begin to blend orally, for example, "What's the word when I say s...u...n... (stretching each sound)."

Students then move to phonic blending, which involves sounding out a printed word and blending the sounds together to form the word.

At Karrendi, our students practice their blending skills every day in InitialLit lessons and MiniLit sessions.

When you listen to your child read (decodable reader in JP), you might see them get stuck on a particular word. Use these blending strategies to help your child read through the word when they are stuck!

Additive blending



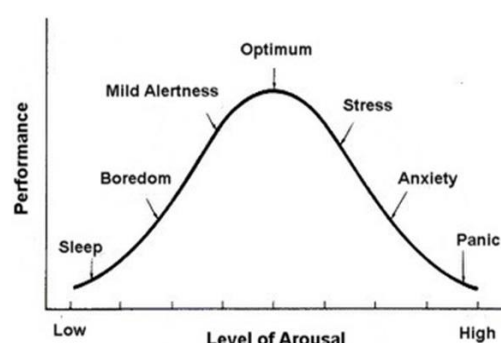
A Message from Mrs Sellwood

Over the past fortnight staff have been focusing on further developing our use of co-regulatory strategies and practices across the school.

We have spent time exploring the importance of stress by looking at the stress arousal curve. The stress arousal curve demonstrates the importance of stress in our lives; too little stress leads to inattention and too much can cause us to feel overwhelmed and unable to concentrate.

One way we address this is by using brain breaks throughout the day to help our students remain at their optimal level for learning. Regular short breaks throughout the day have been proven to improve focus, creativity, social skills and productivity. They are also a quick and effective way to foster connection and belonging.

Ask your child to show you some of the fun brain breaks they have been learning at school!



A Spotlight on Learning

Room 15 Year 3-6 Intensive English Learning Program Ms Alex

This term our class are learning about Indigenous Australian culture and beliefs in HASS and how to write an Information Report on Australian animals in Writing. I asked students, "Why are we learning about this?" Some responses included: "We are new to Australia" and "We want to know the history of this country so when we grow up, we can tell others and our children." Last week we learnt about the echidna and watched a video: The Echidna and The Shade Tree. It told us how echidnas got their spines. Then we made echidnas using clay, match sticks and our growth mindsets. It was so much fun. After that we took photos of our echidnas. Did you know a baby echidna is called a puggle?
