## A Message from Mr Perri

On Tuesday night this week, staff engaged in our first of two *Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC)* sessions this term. We explored the updated curriculum and engaged in activities to apply our learning. The *KS:CPC* is a respectful relationships and child safety curriculum that teaches children from a young age to keep themselves safe and develop skills in knowing what to do when they feel unsafe. The *KS:CPC* is mandated in all Department for Education sites for children and young people from age 3 to year 12.

Currently, the *KS:CPC* is taught in Health lessons for Junior Primary students, and as a class subject in the Middle and Upper Primary Years. Students explore the right to be safe, relationshipsrecognising and reporting abuse and protective strategies.

#### A Message from Miss Cooke

Each year our students have the opportunity to take part in the **Premier's Reading Challenge**. This is a literacy engagement program that was introduced by the Premier in 2004 with the intention of encouraging students to read more books, build enjoyment for reading and improve literacy levels. To complete the challenge, students have until 9<sup>th</sup> September to read twelve books. Every student to complete the challenge receives an award ranging from a certificate to a medal to having their name listed on the Premier's Reading Challenge Hall of Fame Honour Roll.

In order to support our students in this challenge, as a school we have made the decision to take this on as a class team and complete the challenge together. Each class will be working towards reading at least twelve books together, allowing students to build their love of reading whilst still expanding their skills and knowledge around, decoding, comprehension and so on.

Although class teachers are working with students to complete the challenge, we support and encourage any families who want to contribute at home. To learn more about the challenge or to find out how you can take part at home, you can access the website below to see which books are included within the challenge and keep track of how long until the challenge ends. The true benefit of the challenge for family involvement is that family members are able to read with, or to, their child and the book can be added to the record sheet. If you would like a recording sheet to keep track of the books your child reads as part of the challenge, please speak to your classroom teacher. #### **National Reconciliation Week**




