A Message from Mrs Przibilla

Earlier this term results were released from the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection (WEC) survey. Students in years 4-6 participated in the survey in Term 2 answering questions about how they think and feel about their experiences both inside and outside of school. This data doesn't identify students but is broken down into year levels and gender to assist us in determining how we can better support our students to feel emotionally supported and connected at school and engaged in their learning.

Our results showed positive improvements from previous years in lots of areas including generally feeling happy, feeling supported by teachers and having a good relationship with them and regularly having breakfast.

One area requiring improvement is student confidence in their academic abilities. This will be an area of focus for our staff to spend time further developing our student dispositions to all learning areas.

Staff will also use this data to inform supports to be continued as well as researching other supports that can be implemented for students through classroom and yard programs.

Our aim is to ensure all students at Karrendi Primary School feel safe, a sense of belonging and challenged to be the best they can be!

A Message from Miss Cooke

As part of our continued commitment towards improved student outcomes in reading, this year our site made the decision to implement a more comprehensive, evidence-based reading assessment strategy for students in year 3 to 6. *DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)* is a set of short, standardised assessments that are designed to measure specific skills that are related to literacy and reading development. These skills include phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension.

Rather than simply giving students a reading 'level' as previous assessments have done, DIBELS provides teachers and students with feedback on specific skills that students need to develop in order to improve their literacy skills. This assessment program gives teachers and students the ability to engage in three core assessments over the year (beginning, middle and end) in addition to regular, progress monitoring assessments to ensure that the teaching and learning happening in classes is having positive impacts on student learning. By transitioning to this assessment program our teachers are able to work more effectively with the students to collaboratively set individual learning goals that are meaningful and specific to each individual student.

Teaming DIBELS in years 3 – 6 with the comprehensive assessments built into the InitiaLit program in the Junior Primary years (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2), allows us to track learning over time and ensure the effective and consistent use of data to inform and positively impact teaching and learning in every classroom across the school.

Classroom Correspondence

Science in Room 20!

This term in science, Room 20 are learning about the needs of living things in relation to food chains. So far, we have explored ways in which living things obtain the energy and nutrients they need to survive. We have also been practicing scientific language to discuss and classify living things as producers, consumers and decomposers. We recently designed and made our own paper food chains to show the feeding relationships between living things. In the coming weeks, we will learn about some of the native species that are utilised as food by First Nations peoples.











German in Room 20 and Room 19

This term, students in Rooms 20 and 19 have been studying Obst und Gemüse (Fruit and Vegetables). The students have learned the new vocabulary of selected fruit and vegetables (including the unusual choices of der Rettch – radish and die Zitrone – lemon). One of our activities was sampling all of these Obst und Gemüse and decide whether they taste "lecker" (yummy), "so lala" (so so) or "schrecklich" (terrible). We had very brave students, the majority of whom tried everything! Parents and Carers might be asked to

purchase some unusual new selections in the supermarket in the future!
