Community Hub


Our school has been very fortunate in getting an application approved to have a Community Hub on site. The Community Hubs program is a National initiative that is jointly funded by Community Hubs Australia and the Department of Social Services. The partner for the Community Hub program in South Australia is Lutheran Community Care. The Community Hub will be based on site and the hub leader will work in partnership with the Community Hub network, support agencies and school. The Community Hub Leader will engage with families in need to support them to thrive and connect to their communities. This work will involve aspects such as linking families with young children to services, support, learning opportunities, building local connections for families in need and delivering formal and informal skills training. Furthermore, The Hub will focus on supporting families to connect to opportunities in the early year's space, aiming to improve child development and school readiness as well as enhancing settlement outcomes. The Community Hub leader position will be advertised as an SSO position over the coming weeks. We will send a letter home to families with additional information about the Community Hub Leader position when it is approved to advertise.

This semester we are very excited to be involved in the 3D Printers in Primary School project. The project is a joint initiative between the Department for Education and Makers Empire, a South Australian based organisation which helps educators teach design thinking.

We have also started learning how to use the 3D printers and are beginning to print some prototypes of our designed solutions. 
Towards the end of term 4, we will be showcasing our learning with other schools involved in the project at Wayville Showgrounds.




Room 23 students have been using Pamela Allen's book "Who Sank the Boat?" as a basis for their learning in STEM. After investigating
