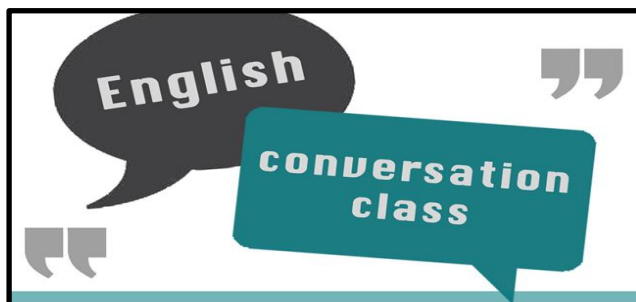

## What is Saver Plus?

- A free ten-month savings program providing financial education, budgeting and savings tips.
- Participants receive up to \$500 from ANZ in matched savings for education costs for themselves or their children.
- Offered in communities across Australia in every state and territory.

### A Saver Plus Participant's Journey



### Who can join?

- Participants must meet all of the below criteria:
- Be 18 years or over
  - Have a child at school or starting next year, or attend vocational education themselves
  - Have regular income from paid employment (themselves or their partner)
  - Have a current Health Care or Pensioner Concession Card
  - Be in receipt of an eligible Commonwealth social security benefit, allowance or payment\*

### How did it start?

Saver Plus began in 2003 as a Brotherhood of St Laurence and ANZ pilot program with 268 participants in three sites across Victoria and New South Wales.

Since then, the program has expanded to all Australian states and territories, reaching more than 40,000 people, making it the largest and longest-running program of its kind in the world.

- \$23m+ total amount saved by participants
- \$18m+ matched funds paid by ANZ

I have worked for the Department for Education for over 20 years. During that time, I have been fortunate to work across many areas including, schools, governance, policy and programs. Most recently, within the Aboriginal Education Directorate.

My ACEO role is to support individual Aboriginal students and their families in the school by:

- working with teachers in the implementation of Aboriginal Cultural Studies and Aboriginal perspectives in curriculum design and delivery
- undertaking administrative functions
- contributing to site learning plans and individual learning plans to improve Aboriginal student social development, wellbeing and learning
- supporting teaching staff develop and maintain relationships with Aboriginal students, parents and families
- promoting an Aboriginal community voice in educational decision-making, and
- providing advice on the cultural diversity of Aboriginal groups.

I am looking forward to working together with our Aboriginal students, their families and community in supporting our Aboriginal children to be proud and confident learners, achieving at their highest potential.
