Playing with Sticks

Many of you may have noticed the stick play that is happening in our school. It is amazing to see the imaginative creations that our students are building and the collaboration and negotiation that is happening as our students work together to build houses and sometimes, whole villages!

The benefit of this kind of play is highlighted in the quote below:

'Children are competent, confident and capable learners, who are able to make choices and decisions for themselves. They are naturally curious and inquisitive and want and need to find out how the world around them works. They learn by experience and when that experience is mastered, they need to find opportunities that will stimulate and challenge them further.' Outdoor Play

We want our students to have lots of opportunities to learn by experience and to practise negotiating, problem solving and working together through a real-world engaging task.

We are making sure that we are speaking to students and working with them to support their understanding of how to play with sticks safely. Classes are talking about safe play and we are supporting students to solve problems calmly and constructively when issues arise.

Pupil Free Day

Next Friday is our Pupil Free Day. On this day we will be beginning our learning journey focussing on 'The Berry Street Education Model'. The Berry Street Education Model (BSEM) provides strategies for teaching and Learning that enables educators to increase engagement of students with complex, unmet learning needs and to successfully improve all students' self-regulation, relationships, wellbeing, growth and academic achievement.

We are very lucky to be able to have our entire staff involved in this Professional Development and look forward to a very productive day.
