Camp 2018









Last week the years 5/6/7 students from rooms 3, 5, 7 & 17 went on school camp. We went to Arbury Park Outdoor School in Bridgewater. It was a fantastic experience for everyone, learning about the environment and building and developing relationships with peers and teachers. The students were given the opportunity to take part in a range of activities, all being outside and hands on. These activities included;

- Nature's recyclers: students searched the forest or living things that help recycle leaves and nutrients.
 This included looking under logs and leaves to find these recyclers.
- Mission survival: students had to work as a team to solve problems and move around 'toxic waste' without damaging the environment.
- Freshwater life: students used nets to catch freshwater creatures and then looked at them under microscopes.
- Orienteering: students used maps and compasses to navigate around Arbury Park to find checkpoints.

The weather was perfect the whole time and the students really enjoyed the experience.
